

TEACHING

The Master of Arts in Teaching program is designed for those who have completed a bachelor's degree in non-educational fields and wish to earn the Michigan Secondary Standard Teaching Certificate. Students in the MAT program will bring valuable experience and expertise to assist in their exploration of the practice of teaching. In addition to learning about adolescent learners and how to teach them, MAT coursework spurs students to think about the goals, values, beliefs and assumptions underlying formal schooling, and to consider schools in social, political and historical contexts. Students interested in this degree program should submit a Transcript Evaluation Request Form (https://umdearborn.formstack.com/forms/transcript_evaluation_request_form/) in order to receive a draft plan of study prior to admission. The MAT coursework will be offered weekdays in the late afternoon, evening hours, and online to enable students to earn the degree through part-time study. Students who are employed will be able to complete the degree through after-work study except for the Directed Teaching requirement. This will occur during the last semester of each student's residency.

Admission Requirements & Application

Eligibility for regular admission includes:

- Completed application form
- \$60.00 application fee
- Official transcript(s) from each college/university attended
- Completion of a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- 3.0 (B) undergraduate/graduate grade point average or better
- Three professional letters of recommendation using required form
- Statement of purpose
